Purpose

This unit standard is intended for those who merchandise chillers and freezers. People credited with this unit standard are able to display stock in chillers and freezers, and replenish chillers and freezers.

This unit standard is intended for people who carry out work in a wholesale and retail industry.

2. This unit standard is to be assessed in the context of merchandising in the wholesale and retail sector, and should be assessed in conjunction with other merchandiser related unit standards.
3. To demonstrate competence, at a minimum, evidence is required of the application of organisational policies and procedures relating to replenishing chillers and freezers, identifying the correct merchandising techniques applicable to chillers and freezers and adhering to cold chain principles.
4. Assessment evidence may be collected from a real workplace or simulated workplace in which merchandising activities are carried out.
5. Performance of all elements in this unit standard must comply with all relevant workplace requirements.
6. Regulations and legislation relevant to this unit standard include the following:
 - Labour Act, No. 11 of 2007.
 - Occupational Health and Safety Regulations relating schedule 1(1) Act 11 of 2007, Regulation No 156, 92).

Elements and Performance Criteria

Element 1: Display stock in chillers and freezers

Range:

- Cold chain requirements refer to uninterrupted series temperature-controlled supply chain activities from refrigerated production, storage and distribution activities, to associated equipment and logistics.

Performance Criteria

- 1.1 Grouping and layout of stock in applicable chillers and freezers is identified.
- 1.2 Regular ticketing and signage is used as applicable to chillers and freezers.
- 1.3 Promotional ticketing and signage is used as applicable to chillers and freezers.
- 1.4 Stock in the chillers and freezers is displayed in line with cold chain and organisational requirements.

Element 2: Replenish chillers and freezers

Range:

- Relevant parties include but are not limited to: managers, supervisors, buyers, suppliers.

Performance Criteria

- 2.1 Cold chain requirements in respect of replenishing stock in chillers and freezers are implemented as it applies to the organisation.
- 2.2 Products requiring replenishment are identified in line with organisational procedures.
- 2.3 Stock from the storage areas to the shop floor is moved in line with organisational procedures.
- 2.4 Stock is unpacked in a manner that prevents or minimises losses and damages.

- 2.5 Stock is merchandised in line with organisation shelf filling procedures.
- 2.6 Stock is rotated in line with organisation shelf filling procedures.
- 2.7 Relevant parties are informed of excess stock and low stock holdings in line with organisational requirements.
